Seasonal Allergens OF THE Northwest


Runny nose, watery eyes, and **sneezing** can result from inflammation of the mucous membranes in your sinuses. In plain terms they are **allergy symptoms** brought on by allergic rhinitis.

Allergy symptoms appear when airborne allergens stimulate an immune reaction in sensitive individuals. For seasonal sufferers, the symptoms occur only at certain times of year, when trees, grasses and weeds are pollinating. 
